Business conducted at the Roosevelt Town Board Regular Monthly Meeting held at the Pine Center Sportsman Club on Tuesday, May 9th, 1972. This was the postponed May 2nd meeting.

Meeting called to order at 8 P.M. by Chairman Klause, with all members present.

Several groups of citizens were present from the Platte Lake, Little Whitefish Lake and Camp Lake areas and asked for road repair and maintenance on their respective roads. The Board acknowledged their claims, but pointed out that they can only do so much with the money and equipment available. The road inspection trip will be held sometime this month, and the Board will keep these requests in mind when arriving at these areas. Some citizens questioned the wisdom of operating expensive equipment without sufficient hydraulic oil to raise the blade, wing, etc. They claim this actually happened, and talked to the operator about it.

Constables Davis and Schaefer also were present and asked that the Resolution of October 6th, 1970 be rescinded so that they may patrol the roads again. Chairman Klause pointed out that only ONE thing was forbidden in that Resolution, and that was patrolling the roads. Too much "riding around", too much mileage expenses, not enough income were the reasons for the Resolution, he said. The Board took no action on their request for rescinding the Resolution.

Meeting called to order at 8:15 P.M. by Chairman Klause, with all members present.

Several taxpayers were present and the big topic was roads, especially winter roads. The big problem for the town board is getting snowplowing equipment in and out of these hilly, rocky, twisting roads without actually rebuilding them. Many of these roads grew out of trails and were never meant to be maintained by heavy machinery. When cabin owners along these roads retire and decide to live here the year around--as they have every right to do--it is time for the people and the town board to be realistic about their roads. Heavy machinery CANNOT snake in and out between trees and narrow banks like automobiles and snowmobiles. Two cars cannot pass, even in the summertime, in many places on the Camp Lake and Platte Lake roads, to name only two. Either the roads will have to be widened, straightened, and/or leveled; or the maintenance equipment will have to be maneuverable enough to negotiate these roads; or these taxpayers will have to be abandoned in the wintertime. If they live on a town road we CANNOT do this. A solution must be found now, in the summertime. The Board is sincere and concerned about these roads, but has no funds.

To succeed Frank Groshong, the Board appointed Dean Allen as Road Overseer.

Appointed Thorman Vian as responsible for emptying the barrel at the Camp Lake Public Landing.

The Board directed the clerk to write to the executive secretary of the Minnesota Association of Township Officers for answers to some of the legal questions involving township roads.

Only one of the men could be hired because of the limited funds available from the County and the Federal Government. One man was picked because of his experience and other qualifications, and was put to work the next morning, January 26th.

Under the EEA terms, 100% of the labor and administrative costs will be refunded to the town by the Federal Government.

At the February 1st meeting, one man was removed from road work, and Frank Groshong was made Road Overseer by unanimous vote.

Breitling, Vian and Swan left Pine Center at 8:30 A.M., drove to Dean Allen's and picked him up. Left Allen's at 9 A.M., went south on #13 to Public Landing on Platte Lake. Back to #2, east to Felenschock's. East on #2 to Pine Center, north on #8 one-half mile to Rehling's. Fence too close to north side of road. Brush should be cut, bank sloped off to facilitate snowplowing. North on #8 to Klause's road, culvert between Klause and Cooley is longer than necessary (36' x 18"). East to Camp Lake to end of road at point. Back to #8 (10 A.M.), went north to Town Line road, east to Camp Lake. Beavers have been removed by game warden Sanbeck, the culvert one mile east of #8 now O.K. Went south at fork, wye around at Kotten's on south shore of northwest bay of the lake. Went north on Lake road to Lish's at point. Hilly, rocky, twisting road. Back to #8, went south one mile, then west one mile on gravel road. Some gravel needed on west end. South on Roosevelt-Platte Lake town line road, some gravel is needed in hole. Back to #2 to Pine Center, east to town Dump, then to Pete Evans' road (11 A.M.). 24' x 24" culvert rusted OUT. Needs 32' x 18" culvert to replace. To Buzz Schmolke's, then to Van Keuren's. Culvert just south of VK's yard needs 4-foot extension on each end (12"). Beyond VK's to Schmolke's, ruts in this yard need leveling, caused by grader turning in soft earth. Deep culvert north of Van Keuren's needs a 20' x 12" replacement. Went to west shore of Whitefish Lake (11:30). East on #2 to Deutsch's and Anderson's. Culvert 100' south of road fork is plugged (26' x 12"). West end should be ditched. West on #2 to Pete's house, then past Pelarski's. West on #2 to west Camp Lake road to Public Landing (1 P.M.) West on #2 to Pine Center, stopped at Snodgrass' for lunch, 1/2 hour. South on #8 to Roscoe's and Forter's roads. Back to #8, west on Orton's road, turned at Game & Fish Dept. road. Back on #8, south to east Rock L. road. Road blocked, gate closed and padlocked (McKeetherin??). Private or public road? Back to #8, south to north Platte Lake road. At Behrendt's and Dye's the brush should be cut, but Mrs. Dye has been objecting. This is a two-rod road, straightened 10-15 years ago. Turn (loop) at 2:30 P.M. Then south Platte Lake road to end at Davis'. Found old culvert about 75' south of Forte's mailbox. Needs 28' x 12" replacement.

Back to #8, then on east side of Long Lake to Alma Amundson's (3 P.M.), then north to east side of Bull Dog Lake. Back to #8, then north to Bass Lake road (Reddick's), then #8 to Wayne Williams' road. C/L of road is about 2 1/2 feet to the south, but road is 33' wide. At Gauthier's corner

the road is $4\frac{1}{2}$ feet south and the road is still 33' wide, but at the shoulder. At the power poles the C/L is $5\frac{1}{2}$ feet south. At Williams' corner the road is 9 feet south at C/L. In other words, the road has moved from $2\frac{1}{2}$ ' to 9' south, a total of $6\frac{1}{2}$ feet, using the fence and the power poles as guides. Wayne insists that the fence and poles are not correctly laid out, but he would agree to moving his mailbox. Gauthier's road is about $3\frac{1}{2}$ feet too far east, should be widened on the west side. Went on Gauthier's road to end (at cabins).

Back to #8, to Tate's, then to Erskine Lake Public Landing. Culvert on road should be 32' x 14". Back to Pine Center at 4:30 P.M.
