The town board met at Schellin's store Rosenbush Frank Smude and Permit Cortin signed their Oath of office Mr Rosenbush was elected chairman of the town Board the Board agreed to pay the Treasurer and the Clerk 3 per cent for 1950-1950 all bills presented were paid

June 14 1951

The Town Board met at Schellin's store for Equalization and Frank Smude was called up for a raise on his taxes The Board called for one hundred per cent raise but settled for 50 percent on Item 21 Class 3 and \$100 on Item 4 Class 2

Due to an error by the township assessor 53 head of cattle were placed in the high grade class, which should have been placed in with the other cattle.

The 53 head were averaged at \$16.62 and the other 122 cattle averaged \$16.61 which shows it was an error.

We wish to draw your attention to this. Be it resolved that these 53 head of cattle be placed in the other cattle class instead of the high grade class.



March 17, 1952

Town Board met at Schellins Store & qualified Ray Holmes as clerk, Henry Peterson Gravelle, Perry Van Keuren as Supervisor. Perry Van Keuren was appointed Chairman.

August 16, 1952

The Town Board met with the people of Platt Lake & agreed to maintain the road into the new addition for 3 years with the help of the people of Platt Lake at \$2.00 per person for 3 years & then to take over the road without aid. Beginning August 1952.

March 10 1953

The Town Board met at Schellins Store for annual meeting. Clifford Mathison was elected sup. for 3 years, Frank Smude Treas. for 2 years. Kermit Arton assessor for 2 years.

The Board met June 10 1954

for equalization

Gayle Christopherson was raised on the maintenance value from 2010.00 to 800.00 as the board voted for an increase.

## Minutes of the Proceedings of the Annual Town Meeting

The Annual Town Meeting, held in the Town of Roosevelt in the County of Crow Wing and State of Minnesota, at Pine Center on the 13 day of March, 1961, was called to order by Wm Falsenschie

and \_\_\_\_\_ was then chosen to preside as Moderator at the meeting.

The Moderator, at the opening of the meeting, stated the business to be transacted and the order of same, as follows: To elect one Supervisor for the term of three years, to fill the place of Fred Rosenbush whose term expires; one ~~Town Clerk~~, one Treasurer, one Assessor, 1 Justice of the Peace, 1 Constable, one ~~Town School Superintendent~~

Also to determine by ballot \_\_\_\_\_

and to do any other business proper to be done at said meeting.

That said business would be entertained in the following order: 1st—The election by ballot of Town officers; the voting by ballot whether \_\_\_\_\_

the polls to be kept open throughout the day. 2nd—The general business of the Town to be taken up and proceeded with until disposed of.

The Moderator then stated that the following By-Law \_\_\_\_\_ had been proposed to be voted on by ballot: "Resolved, That \_\_\_\_\_

Proclamation of opening of the polls was then made by the Moderator, and the polls opened and the election of Town officers proceeded.
